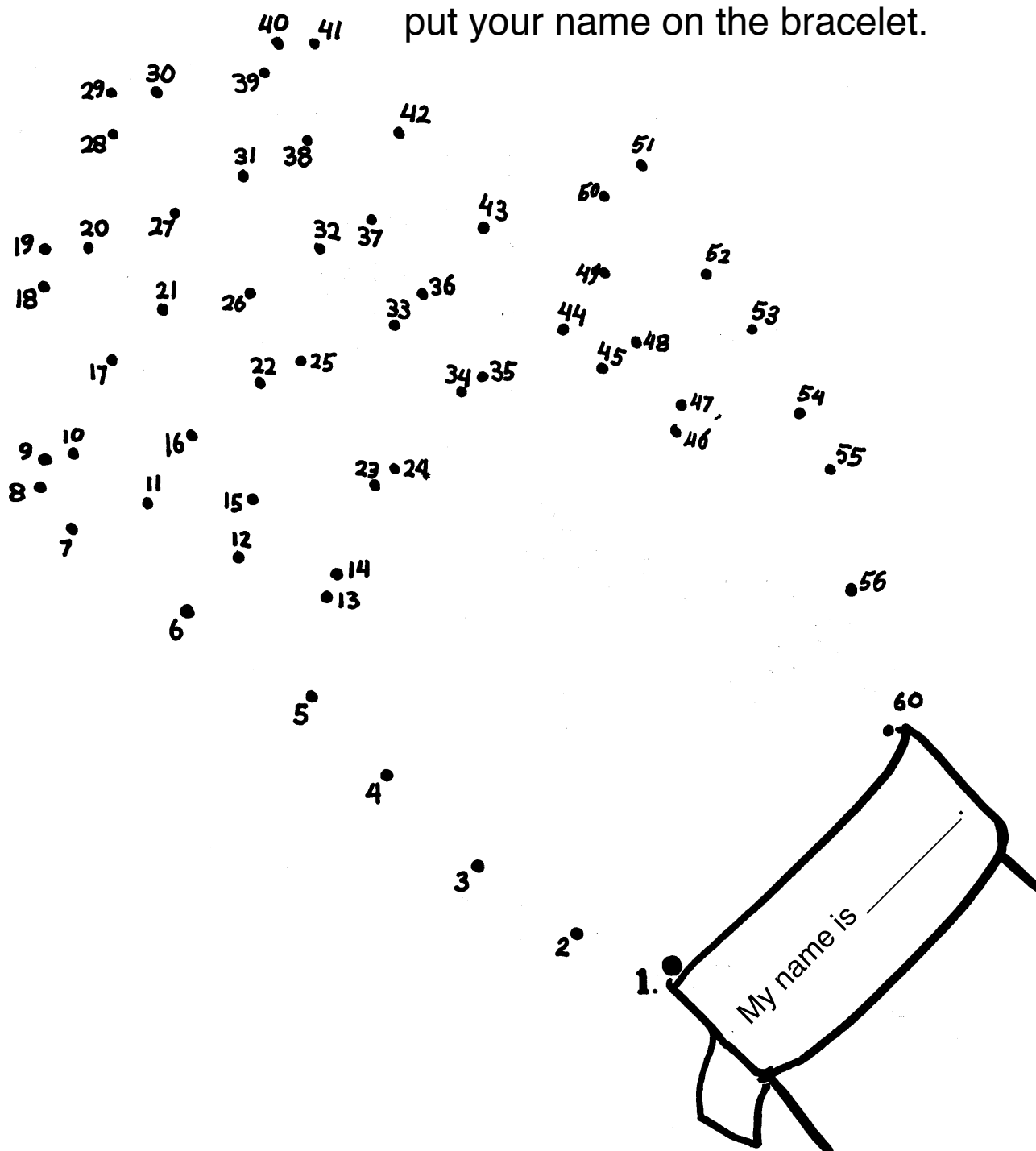

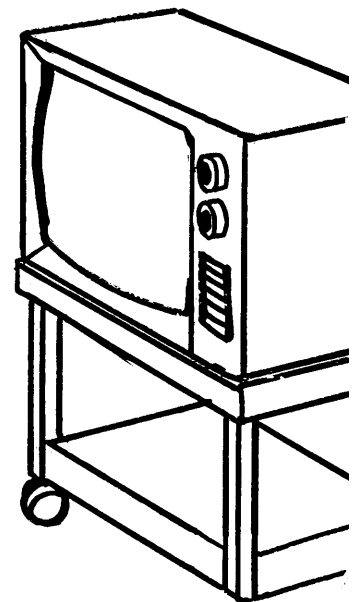
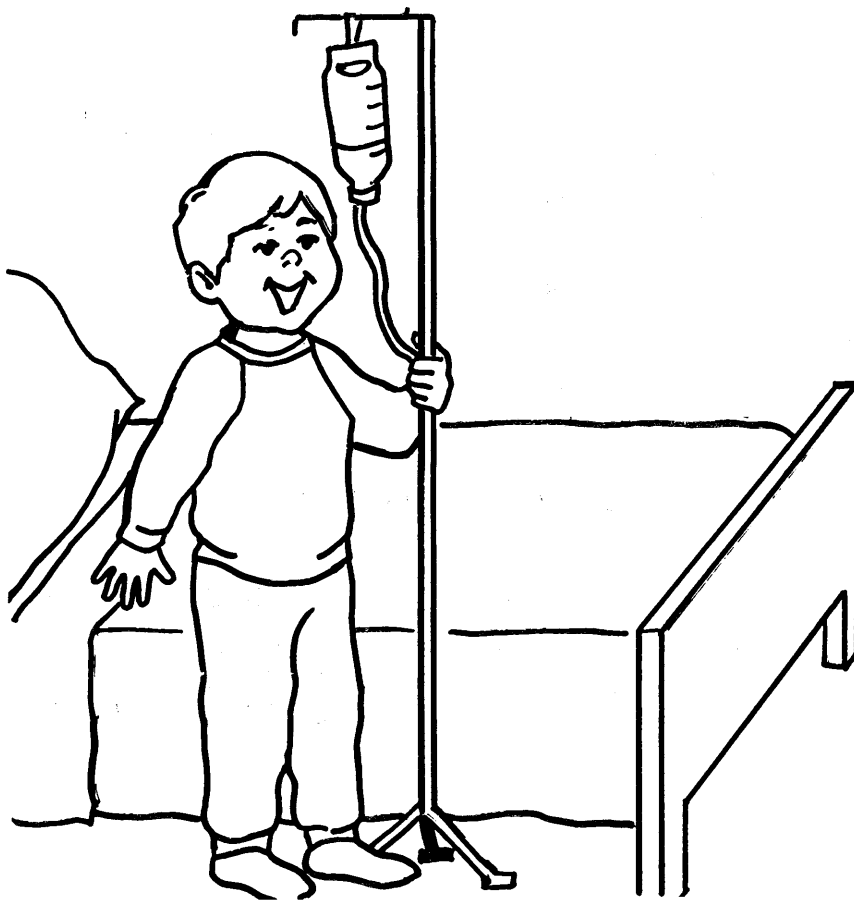
first come to the hospital you will go the Registration Desk. Your parents will answer some questions and you'll get a name bracelet to wear on your wrist.

When you need medicine to get better, there are

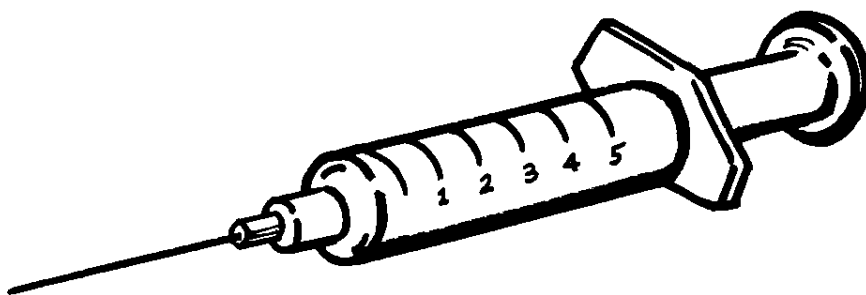
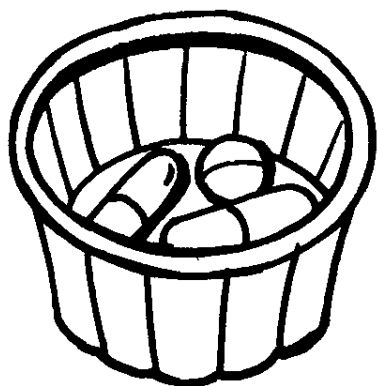
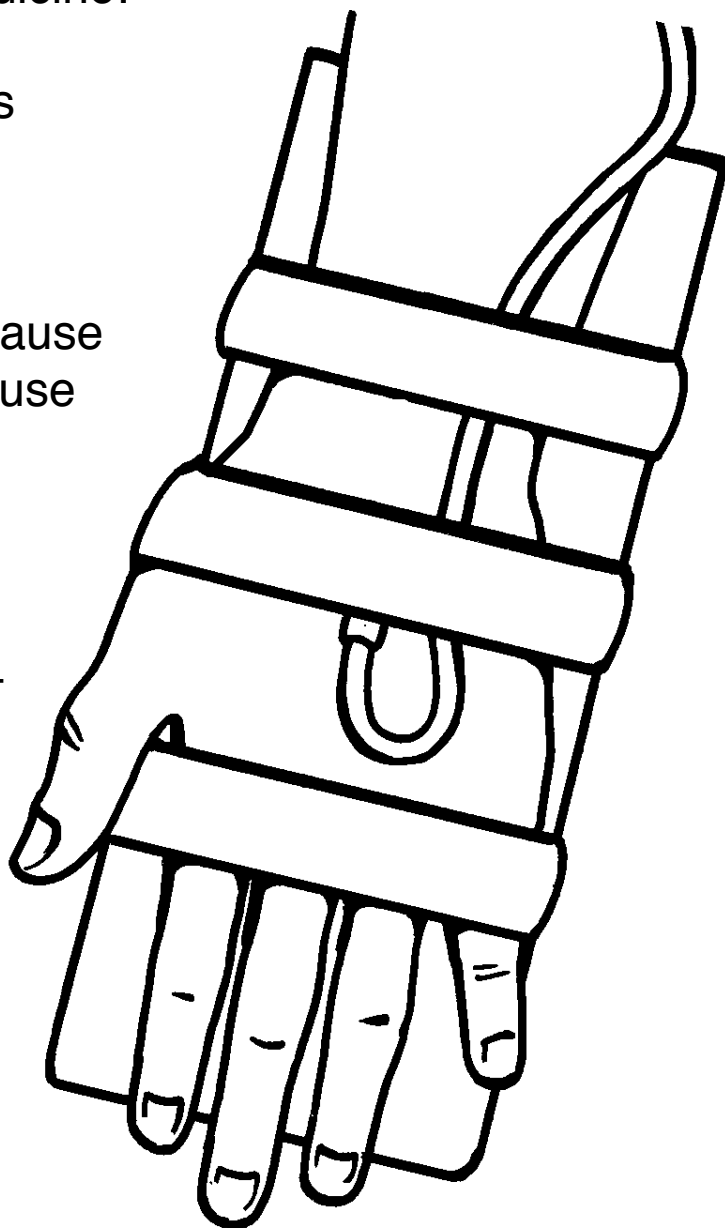
a lot of ways you may get medicine:

You need to get medicine because it helps you get well, not because you are bad or have done something wrong.

Remember to only take the medicine an adult gives you— an adult knows how much you need to get better.

If your doctor needs a picture of what you look like inside; someone will take a special picture called an x-ray. The hospital has special cameras to take x-rays. X-rays do not hurt—they feel just like having your parents take your picture with your camera at home.
